4. <u>Compulsory Registration</u>

Registration for the 1stSemester Examination is compulsory and will be done at the time of admission. A registration/examination card will be issued to the candidates and that will remain valid till completion of the course. There is no need to issue admit card for every semester.

5. Form Fill-up

Regular Students will not be required to fill-up any form for University Examination for regular papers. Examination fees will be collected at the time of admission. The College will send the list of appearing students along with the requisite fee to the University before cutoff date.

6. <u>Back Paper Form Fill-up</u>

For students desiring to appear in any back paper (S) they would be required to fill up the examination forms. Those who fail in any paper in a semester or unable to appear any semester or unable to submit forms for back papers of 2/3/4/5/6 may appear in those papers in subsequent semester within 6yrs from the date of admission.

A student failing in a paper of semester 1 will be allowed to appear for the paper in semester 2. If he/she fails to clear the back paper in semester 2, he/she will get the next opportunity in semester IV, semester VI only.

7. Cancellation of Admission

If a student doesn't appear for all the paper in both in 1st& 2nd Semester Examinations, his/her admission for the said course will be cancelled.
